FROM THE SOCIAL JUSTICE DESK: This week was to follow last week's but a STOP PRESS has come in: 100 retired judges, prominent legal academics, lawmakers and leading practitioners from NZ and abroad have raised the alarm that our government is about to trade away - in secret - an important part of our powers of self-government. The Trans-Pacific Partnership agreement is being negotiated this week in the US by 9 Pacific countries. The legal fraternity alert makes it clear that the Americans will insist (as they have with other similar agreements) that the TPP should allow foreign corporations to stop our Government from changing NZ law in a way they think might undermine their value.
